Senior Year – Students continue clinic

Each school year safety and first aid, sanitation practices, school rules, agenda book review and safety drills are taught and/or reviewed. Incoming students will begin a career portfolio which is updated periodically throughout the program.

First Marking Period

- Review client procedures and safety precautions related to client services written and practical
- Review chemistry relating to Cosmetology
- Theory hair color chapter and formulation
- Review hair tinting and bleaching including frosting, tipping and streaks

- Review hairstyling—including pin curls, finger-waving, and blow waving

- Review facials and massage, skin care, make-up, depilatory, eyebrow arching, shaving
- Nail tips, wraps, and acrylics
